
## Fiddler's Choice

Fiddler and composer John MacDougall (1925-2008) is thought to have composed more than 38,000 pieces, sometimes as many as 65 tunes in a day. The Mabou fiddler kept them secret, claiming they came to him from deceased musicians. His cousin fiddler Ian MacDougall is now sharing many of them. Luthier William "Bill" G. Sampson, WGS Violins, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, recently wrote "Fiddler's Choice" for a special event to honor John MacDougall. (There are at least 2 other tunes by that fine tune name, published in the mid 1990s).

MacDougall entertained regularly at the Glenora Distillery (America's first single malt whisky distillery), Glenville, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia; and was the inspiration for their Fiddler's Choice Whisky. Glenora will host an "International Night of a Thousand Fiddles" on Saturday, August 31, 2019, to set a world record for fiddle playing and whisky drinking.
